# Home-cooked deliciousness

#### Ingredients

Rice Tomato Cinnamon Cardamom


Lamb Tomato sauce Cumin Garlic Red chilli powder Onion Oil Green chilli Coriander Traditional Saudi Arabian Kabsa recipe by Junaid

#### Method

- 1. Cut the garlic, onion and tomato into slices.
- 2. Put some oil in the pan and wait 3 mins.
- 3. Add the onion and wait until they turn a gold colour.
- 4. Add the green chilli, garlic, cinnamon, cumin and mix them.
- 5. Add tomato, tomato sauce and mix them for about 5 mins.
- 6. Put the meat in and mix well for 5 mins. Leave to cook for 30 mins.
- 7. Add salt, red chilli powder and cardamom.
- 8. Add the rice after washing it many times.
- 9. Leave it for 15-20 mins and take off the heat.
- 10. Leave for 5 mins and then it's ready to eat!
