Cracking horror stories

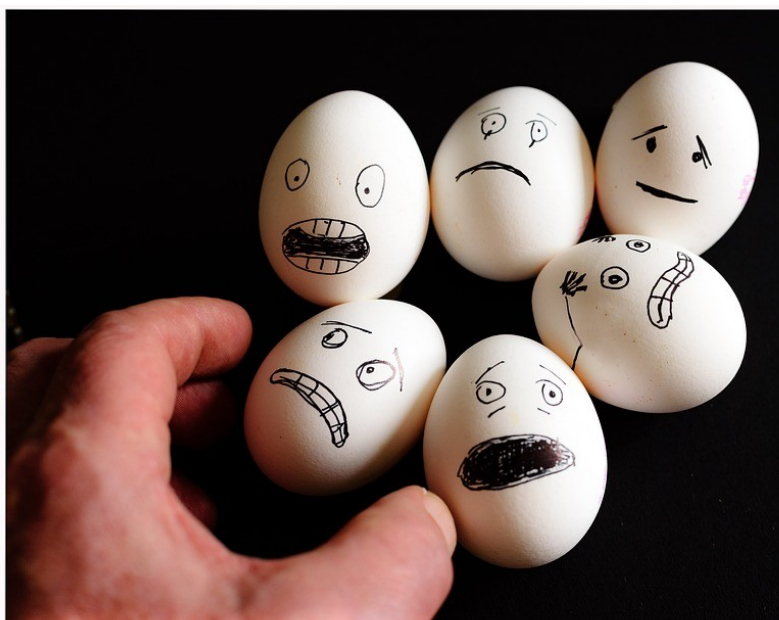
An egg-tremely awful afternoon
